

Used in tandem, dental implants and Botox can reduce or eliminate migraines, says Dr. Vladimir Pastouk, of *Dental and Cosmetic Solutions*.

Chronic headaches are interfering with my daily activities. My friend suggested I visit the dentist, but what good will that do?

You should heed your friend's advice, especially if you are missing teeth or some of your teeth are broken or worn. Think of the anatomy of your mouth as a tripod. If any part of the structure is missing or weakened, the three-pronged support becomes a double support. This creates a bigger workload and places increased pressure on the jaw's temporomandibular joint (TMJ), ultimately changing how your muscles respond to otherwise simple tasks, such as chewing or smiling. Research demonstrates that most types of chronic headaches, including migraines, are connected to the TMJ, oral and dental health issues, chewing, and the movement of facial muscles.

What can the dentist do to relieve my pain?

A combination of replacing missing or damaged teeth with dental implants and receiving periodic Botox injections reduces—and often eliminates—many headaches. Implants add much-needed support, thus restoring the mouth's tripod structure and relieving excess pressure from the jaw and facial muscles. Botox injections relax facial muscles and lessen headache symptoms. I recommend getting both treatments because dental implants correct the architecture of your mouth, while Botox relaxes the muscles. As a bonus, both approaches provide cosmetic effects.

Can I afford it?

Most dental insurance plans cover implants. Many medical insurance plans cover Botox treatments with a confirmed medical diagnosis of chronic migraines.
