

Most of us understand that Botox is a natural extension of the services offered by a plastic surgeon. But here, Dr. Vladimir Pastouk, of *Dental and Cosmetic Solutions*, explains why a trip to the dentist might be a great option as well.

In addition to smoothing facial wrinkles, I have heard there are also medical applications for Botox. What are they?

Botox injections have several medical and dental applications. It is an adjunctive treatment for TMJ (temporo-mandibular disorders), in which Botox injected into facial muscles helps relieve the jaw tension by adjusting the strength of the muscle that is overworked. Similarly, it also can help people who suffer from tension headaches and chronic migraines.

As the director of education at the Pacific Training Institute for Facial Aesthetics for the U.S. and Europe, I travel the world educating dentists on using Botox. Next month I will be lecturing dentists in Switzerland on how to use Botox for dental applications, and I am currently preparing to present to the dental community worldwide the first documented case of using Botox for hygiene reasons.

We can use Botox injections to relax the soft tissue around the area of dental surgery, which improves the healing for our patients

It is important to note that when Botox is used for dental or medical applications, it is sometimes covered by insurance and those dental applications still provide cosmetic benefits.

Why is a dentist who is trained by the Pacific Training Institute for Facial Aesthetics (PTIFA) among the most qualified to do Botox injections?

It is a logical extension of what dentists already do. We are well trained in the musculature and anatomy of the face, so we are among the most qualified because we focus exclusively on the facial area, when other medical specialists, like plastic surgeons and dermatologists, work on the entire body.

There is an interconnection with dental function muscles and facial expression muscles, so dentists that have been trained by our institute have the most knowledge of muscles in

In the next five to 10 years, I believe more than half of all Botox injections will be done in dental offices.

My patients always comment on how convenient it is to get their teeth cleaned and at the same time get a Botox injection to help with their dental needs, as well as to smooth out wrinkles. And a dental office visit would not normally prompt questions or curiosity.
