Dental Health for Diabetics

Diabetics must be diligent about dental care. Here, Dr. Vladimir Pastouk, of *Dental & Cosmetic Solutions*, reveals critical reasons why.

Q If I have diabetes, am I candidate for dental implants or other oral surgical procedures?

A Yes. Diabetes should not prevent you from receiving the benefits of modern dentistry. Seek out a dentist who understands and knows the best approach to managing your diabetes. I only perform dental implants and other surgical procedures if your diabetes is under control.

I also temper the technique slightly because diabetes can slow the healing process. Of course, the best approach is avoiding the need for dental implants in the first place. Diabetes affects the nutrition around the implant, so diabetics must be extra diligent about following the

dentist's recommendations and keeping all appointments. Our office emphasizes a special hygiene program for our patients with diabetes.

Q What is the relationship between diabetes and my gums?

A Diabetes increases your risk of developing advanced gum disease. In some cases, gum disease may be present—and even worsen—without symptoms that are apparent to the patient. Just as diabetes can trigger gum disease, gum disease itself can sometimes signal a worsening of diabetes. If you notice swollen or bleeding gums, a persistent bad taste, or other unusual symptoms in your mouth, it is time to schedule a gum check and dental health evaluation.
